7		I. Purpose		
8		1.1These regulations have been prepared in general to aid in the orderly		
9		development of Houston County, Texas, and provide guidelines that will lead		
10		desirable environment. These regulations supercede all previous Houston		
11		County Subdivision Regulations. Specifically they have been prepared for the		
12		following purposes:		
13	1.2	To furnish the developer with guidance and assistance in the expedient		
14	0.0000	preparation and approval of his or her plat.		
15	1.3	To protect the citizens of Houston County by insuring minimum subdivision		
16	1.500	and development guidelines for residential commercial and industrial		
17		subdivisions.		
18	1.4	To provide for the welfare of the public by providing guidelines for the location.		
19	1.4	design, and construction of roadways, roadway intersections, drainage, water and		
20		waste water improvements and other features that provide for the safety of the		
21		general public.		
22	11.1	To prevent the county road system from being burdened with substandard streets		
23	11.1	or roads in the future.		
24	11.2	To regulate on-site sewage facilities and to protect rights of owners of interest in		
25	11.2	groundwater.		
26	11.3	To respond to real and substantial threat to public health and safety and to		
27	11.5	significantly advance the health and safety purpose overall, and not to impose a		
28		greater burden than is necessary to achieve the health and safety purposes for the		
29	11.4	general public.		
30	11.+	To fulfill the obligations mandated upon Houston County as dictated by state

32	2.1	2. Definition of Terms		
33	2.1	Subdivision:		
34		Defined by Section 232.001, Local Government Code, as "The division of a tract		
35		of land into two or more parts to lay out (1) a subdivision of the tract, including a		
36		addition; (2) lots; or (3) streets, alleys, squares, parks, or other parts of the tract		
37		intended to be dedicated to public use or for the use of the purchasers or owners		
38		of lots fronting on or adjacent to streets, alleys, squares, parks, or other parts."		
39		The Houston County Commissioners' Court has adopted guidelines,		
40		incorporated in these Regulations as Appendix A, stating when they require		
41		owners to file a plat for a subdivision.		
42	2.2	Street or Road:		
43		The terms "street" or "road" are interchangeable and mean a vehicular way or a		
44		way for vehicular traffic and are used to describe all vehicular ways regardless of		
45		any other designation they may have. Streets and roads shall be dedicated to the		
46		public except as indicated in Section 7.		
4-	2.3	Arterial Streets or Roads:		
18		Arterial streets or roads are those that are principally regional in nature and are		
11)		used for through or heavy traffic and shall be divided into two classifications:		
50		2.3.1 Streets or roads that will serve vehicular traffic beyond the limits of the		
51		subdivision; and/or connect one collector or arterial with one or more		

2.3.2 Streets or roads that are existing county roads, and carry a numerical designation.

collectors or arterials.

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2.4 Collector street or roads: Collector streets or roads are those that connect arterial streets or roads with local 3 streets or roads. 4 2.5 Local Streets or Roads: 5 Local streets or roads are those that principally provide direct access to lots in 6 a subdivision. 8 2.6 Urban Street: For the purposes of this ordinance, an urban street is any street situated such that 9 the spacing of driveways is less than 100 feet apart for a distance of 1/4 of a mile. 10 This distance does not apply to a subdivision using curb and gutter. Any curb and 11 12 gutter street will be considered an urban street. 13 2.7 Rural Street: For the purposes of this ordinance, a rural street is any street situated such that 14 spacing of driveways is greater than 100 feet apart. 15 2.8 Major Highway or Road: 16 All roads maintained by the Texas Department of Transportation are considered 17 major highways or roads. 18 2.9 Precinct Commissioner: 19 All references in these Regulations to a "Precinct Commissioner" shall be 20 construed to refer to the Houston County Commissioner in whose precinct 21 the subdivision is located. If the subdivision is located in more than one precinct. 22 approvals affecting the subdivision as a whole shall be obtained from each of the 23 affected Precinct Commissioners. 24 2.10 Subdivision Coordinator: 25 All references in these Regulations to a "Subdivision Coordinator" shall be 26 construed to refer to the Houston County Commissioner in whose precinct 27 the subdivision is located, and/or the Commissioner's designated authority. (Such 28 as another county employee). 29 2.11 Minimum Requirement: 30 Requirements when defined as minimum shall be the minimum acceptable 31 requirements. The county may, due to issues pertaining to each unique sub-32 33 division, increase such requirements. 14 2.12 Owner: All references in these Regulations to an "Owner" shall be construed to refer to 3.5 the person or persons possessing title and/or lienholder to the property within the 36 subdivision. This can also refer to the owner's surveyor, engineer, attorney, or 37 planner who has been given written authority to represent the owner. 38 2.13 39 Developer: Persons, corporations, organizations, governmental or governmental subdivision 40 41 or agency, estates, trust, partnerships, associates, incorporations or other entities. 42 which undertake the activities covered by these regulations. 43 2.14 Preliminary Plat: A map or drawing of a proposed subdivision meeting the requirements of Section 44 45 3.2. 46 2.15 Final Plat: A map or drawing of a proposed subdivision prepared in a manner suitable for 47 recording in the County records and prepared in conformance with the conditions 48 of preliminary approval previously granted by the Commissioners' Court and 49 meeting the requirements of Section 3.3. 50 Parent Tract: 2.16 51 The original tract prior to any division. 52 53 2.17 Daughter Tract: 54 Any of the tracts created by divisions of a parent tract, including the remainder of 55 the parent tract itself.

3. Platting Procedure 3.1 2 The preliminary and final platting procedure for subdivisions within Houston 3 County will be as follows: 3.1.1 Prior to any subdivision of land and any official submittal of a plat for 4 5 review, the Owner shall set a meeting with the Precinct Commissioner. 6 The Owner shall present a preliminary plat showing the street alignments 7 and the lots. The Precinct Commissioner will provide general comments 8 and requirements to the Owner. Based upon these comments and 9 requirements the Owner or his representative will submit four (4) copies 10 of the revised preliminary plat of the subdivision to the Precinct Commissioners office. 11 12 3.1.2 The Precinct Commissioner and/or the Subdivision Coordinator will review the plat for compliance with the Houston County Subdivision 13 Regulations. 14 The Precinct Commissioner and/or the Subdivision Coordinator will 15 3.1.3 16 return comments and recommendations to the Owner or his agent. 3,1.4 The Owner will address the comments and recommendations and set a 17 meeting with the Precinct Commissioner to resolve the comments. 18 19 3.1.5 The Precinct Commissioner will request placement of the plat on the Commissioners' Court agenda for approval if all comments have been 20 21 addressed or placement of a variance request on the Commissioners Court 72 agenda. 3.1.6 If the property to be platted lies within the extraterritorial jurisdiction 23 24 (ETJ) of a city, then, in that event, the procedure for approval of 25 subdivision plats is hereby exclusively delegated to the city exercising the 26 extraterritorial jurisdiction. 27 Preliminary Plat 28 3.2 The preliminary plat shall be drawn to a scale of one hundred (100) feet to one(1) 29 inch or larger and shall include the following: 30 Proposed name of the recorded subdivision, which shall not have the same spelling as or be pronounced similar to the name of any other sub-3 1 division located within Houston County. 32 33 3.2.2 Total acreage and the number of lots within the subdivision. 3.2.3 A transmittal letter containing the name, address, telephone number and 34 fax number and e-mail address for the subdivision owner. 35 Names of contiguous recorded subdivisions and the owners of contiguous 36 parcels of unsubdivided land, and whether or not contiguous properties 37 38 are platted. 3.2.5 Date of preparation, scale of plat and north arrow. 39 3.2.6 Vicinity sketch map that shall show the relation of the subdivision to well 4() known streets, railroads, and water courses in all directions to a distance 41 at least one (1) mile. 42 3.2.7 Topographical information shall include contour lines on a basis of five 43 44 (5) vertical feet in terrain with a slope of two (2) percent or more, and on a basis of two (2) vertical feet in terrain with a slope of less than two (2) 45 46 percent. All of the foregoing can be obtained from public sources. 47 Topographical information is not required for final plat. 48 Tangent lengths, centerline radii, names, and right-of-way dimensions for 49 all proposed and existing roads and streets. Names of all proposed roads 50 or streets shall not have the same spelling or be pronounced similar to the name of any other street located within Houston County unless such 51

3.2.10 Proposed approximate property line dimensions.

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proposed road or street is an extension of an existing road or street, in

which case it shall be named the same as the existing road or street.

Proposed easements, existing easements and detention ponds.

3.2.11 A statement whether the property is in the extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) of a city or not.

Final Plat

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- 3.3 Since the county must approve or reject the submission within 60 days, it is the obligation of the owner or developer to submit information, provide notices, and schedule hearings in adequate time to permit proper review by the County. If this is not done, the submission will be rejected and a new application must be filed.

 Every final plat submission must include all of the following:
 - 3.3.1 Owners and any lien holder's dedication, and restrictions, if any, duly acknowledged in the manner required for acknowledgment of deeds. The landowners shall dedicate the fee ownership in the land for street, drainage and utility purposes. ("Street or Road" definition, section 2.2). Right-of-way easements for widening roadways or improving drainage must be accompanied by a plat note as found in Section C.1 placing the burden of maintaining the property upon the landowner until a road or drainage improvements are actually constructed on the property.

 The plat must also contain the note as found in Section C.2

3.3.2 A plat note as found in Section C.3 stating that dedication of all public roadways and easements shall be accomplished free of liens except those liens stated in Section 5.2. Any required release of liens shall be provided to the Commissioners' Court.

3.3.3 Perimeter field notes certified by a Registered Professional Land Surveyor. All lot and block monumentations will be set by a Registered Professional Surveyor before recordation of the plat.

3.3.4 All casements of record and visible and apparent that have a designated route shall be shown on the plat. The owner and/or developer will be responsible for coordinating with all utility providers so that the location(s) of all public utility easements that are shown on the final plat.

3.3.5 The plat shall have a statement indicating if all or any portion of the property falls within a flood hazard boundary area as identified on the most current Houston County Flood Hazard Boundary Map (FHBM) published by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

3.3.6 A plat note as found in Section C.4 for Commissioners' Court approval, including authorization for the County Clerk to file the plat for record as found in Section C.5. These notes are to be located in the lower right hand comer of the last sheet of the plat.

3.3.7 A statement of the total length of all streets in the proposed subdivision.

3.3.8 Approval of the incorporated city when the subdivision is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) of that city. The owner must obtain approval by the city before approval by Commissioners' Court.

3.3.9 A letter of serviceability from an entity or entities providing water service, or if no service is available within 300 feet of the subdivision the Owner shall provide documentation prepared by an engineer registered to practice in this state, certifying that adequate groundwater is available for the subdivision and that lots are suitable for private wells.

3.3.10 A person may not file for record or have recorded in the county clerk's office a plat or replat of a subdivision of real property unless the plat or replat has attached to it an original tax certificate from each taxing unit with jurisdiction of the real property indicating that no delinquent ad valorem taxes, including roll back taxes, are owed on the real property.

3.3.11 A statement from the owner acknowledging that it is the responsibility of the owner, not the County, to assure compliance with the provision of all applicable state, federal, and local laws and regulations relating to the environment. This shall be part of the owner's dedication statement on the face of the plat.

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- 3.3.12 Certification by an engineer registered to practice in this state under his or her professional seal that all engineering for roads and drainage within the subdivision have been completed in compliance with these Regulations (including the Engineering Guidelines incorporated as Appendix B) and with all generally accepted engineering standards. The owner may defer this certification by meeting the security requirements of Section 5.2 or Section 5.3.
 - 3.3.13 A signature block as found in Section C.6 on the plat for approval by the Houston County On-Site Sewage Facilities Inspector, showing that they have examined the plat and that the plat is in compliance with the Houston County Private Sewage Facility Regulations, Construction Standards for On Site Sewage Facility Regulations (TNRCC). A representative of the Houston County On-Site Sewage Facilities Inspector. prior to final plat approval, must sign this signature block. This signature block must be incorporated into the plat during the draft stage.
 - 3.3.14 It is the responsibility of the Owner to assure that the proposed name of the subdivision and all road and street names are not duplicated. The Owner shall check with the County Clerk's records for verification.
- 19 3.4 Until the owner meets every subdivision requirement, no approval shall be granted by the Commissioners' Court with regard or concern to any subdivision. 20 21
 - 3.5 At least one week before the date of the Commissioners' Court's meeting for final plat approval, the owner shall submit to the county clerk the original plat and one identical copy. The final plat shall be drawn in permanent ink on reproducible film sheets twenty-four (24) inches wide and thirty-six (36) inches long, with margins of not less than one (1) inch on all sides. The plat shall be drawn at a scale of one hundred (100) feet to one (1) inch or larger. Where more than one sheet is necessary to accommodate the entire area, an index showing the entire subdivision at an appropriate scale shall be attached to the plat. The County Judge's approval and the County Clerk's approval shall be located on the last plat page on the lower right hand corner with the County Clerk's approval being last.
- 31 3.6 Following final approval of the subdivision, the County Clerk will record the plat in the Plat Records of Houston County, Texas, and return the copy to the 32 33 owner with approval and recording information. The Clerk will retain the 34 original of the plat for the county's files.
- 3.7 35 Unless the preliminary plat approval is followed by a final plat approval within 36 one year, the preliminary plat lapses and the subdivision must be resubmitted for 37 approval.
- 38 3.8 The final plat must be recorded within six (6) months of approval by the 39 Houston County Commissioners' Court. The Commissioners' Court may 40 grant a single six (6) month extension. 41

4. Resubdivisions

- 4.1 Once the owner of an existing lot or lots in a legally platted subdivision has 42 43 followed the procedure as found in Sections 3.1 and 3.3, the owner of an existing lot or lots in a legally platted subdivision may initiate a resubdivision by notifying 44 45 the Precinct Commissioner. The Commissioner will place the plat on a 46 Commissioners' Court agenda in order to set a public hearing on the proposed 47 resubdivision.
- 48 4.2 The person proposing the resubdivision must publish notice of the hearing in a 49 local newspaper of general circulation, at private expense. Notice of public 50 hearing signs shall be placed next to all adjacent streets. The signs will be placed on 300-foot intervals. Whoever places the signs will be required to verify in 5 I 52 writing at the public hearing that the signs remained in place during the previous 53 21 days. This will give other owners within the subdivision the opportunity to 54 assert any legal claims against the proposed subdivision.

- 2 4.3 A proposed plat meeting the requirements of these Regulations must be submitted 3 to the Court signed by each owner (including lien-holders) of the property to be 4 resubdivided. The owners of property elsewhere in the subdivision need not give 5 specific written consent.
- 4.4 If the Court finds after the public hearing that the resubdivision will affect no 6 7 established legal rights, it will enter its order partially vacating the original plat 8 and approving the plat of the resubdivision. If the Court finds that the 9 resubdivision will affect established legal rights, it shall not approve the 10 resubdivision without the consent of all affect patties.
- 4.5 A public hearing will not be required if a public hearing for the proposed ii 12 resubdivision was held by a municipality.
 - 5. Road and Drainage Construction
- 5.1 14 To protect the public interest, the Commissioners' Court of Houston County 15 hereby decrees under the provision of Chapter 232 Local Government Code, that 16 the owner of any tract of land that desires to obtain approval of a subdivision plat 17 for recording a plat in the county records shall construct all streets, roads and 18 drainage in said subdivision to the standards and specifications set forth by the 10 Houston Commissioners Court.
- 5.2 20 If the owner desires to have the plat placed on record before completion of 21 construction of the streets, roads and drainage, then the owner shall give a good 22 and sufficient bond, cash, or letter of credit. This security must be payable to the 23 County Judge, or his/her successors in office, of Houston County, Texas, the 24 estimated cost of construction according to the calculations of an engineer 25 registered to practice in this state. The security shall be conditioned on the 26 completion (in compliance with the road and drainage standards and 27 specifications set forth by the Houston County Commissioners' Court) of all 28 the roads, streets and drainage shown on the plat, and such streets, roads and 21) drainage are accepted by the Commissioners' Court.
- 5.3 30 The developer may request partial reductions of the security requirement upon 31 approval by the County Commissioners' Court, upon partial completion of 32 construction of said road and/or drainage.
- The owner shall submit construction plans for streets, roads and drainage and 33 5.4 34 utilities within a platted subdivision to the County Commissioners' Court for 3.5 approval prior to beginning construction. These plans shall show the location all utilities and easements. 30
- 37 5.5 If landscaping and/or irrigation are proposed within the right-of-way, the owner 38 shall create a body (home-owners association, neighborhood association) that 39 will be responsible for the maintenance and liability of the landscaping and/or 4() irrigation system. This body shall have assessment authority to insure the proper 41 funding for maintenance.
- 42 5.6 Once the construction has been completed and the Houston County Commissioners Court has approved the construction, the Owner shall file with the County 43 Clerk a set of "As Built" plans to be attached and recorded with the original plat. 44 45 These plans are to show the improvements as they were actually built.
- 5.7 46 If the County determines that the plat contains flag lots that are a detriment to the 47 public interest, welfare and/or safety, the County may require internal road 48 construction at the sole discretion of the Commissioners' Court.
- 11) 5.8 All postal mailboxes shall meet current U.S. Postal Service and Texas 50 Department of Transportation standards. 51
 - 6. Road Maintenance
- 6.1 52 By accepting a subdivision plat for filing, the Commissioners' Court does not 53 thereby accept the streets in the subdivision for ownership or maintenance by the 54 County. The owner or owners of the platted lots are responsible for maintenance

of all streets or roads within the subdivision until such time as the construction of 2 the roads have been accepted by the Commissioners' Court. 6.2 3 The County will not accept a road for maintenance without the following 4 preconditions: 5 6.2.1 A dedication for the public use of an easement or fee interest in the entire 6 roadway to Houston County. 7 6.2.2 Written certification from an engineer registered to practice in this state 8 that the road was constructed in accordance with the road and drainage 9 standards and specifications set forth by the Houston County 10 Commissioners' Court in effect when the subdivision was legally platted 11 (or has been upgraded to those standards). If the subdivision where the 12 road is located was never platted, it must meet the current guidelines. 6.2.3 Written certification from an engineer registered to practice in this state 13 that the road is currently in compliance with the applicable guidelines. 14 15 The cost of any improvements, maintenance, or repairs required to reach 16 that standard shall be borne by the developer or current landowners, not 17 by the County. 18 6.3 The enforcement of plat restrictions is the responsibility of the developer and 19 other owners in the subdivision. 20 6.4 The County will assume no responsibility for drainage ways in the subdivision. 21 other than those running on or along the streets and roads. Maintenance and 22 liability of landscaped areas within the right-of-way will be the responsibility of 23 the developer, the neighborhood association or other owner entity. 24 7. Private Subdivisions 25 If a developerwishes to create a subdivision utilizing private roads, it must meet 26 following requirements: 27 7.1 The roads must meet all county road standards, except where specific variance 28 has been granted by the Commissioners' Court for adequate cause in each case. 29 7.2 The subdivision plat and restrictions must contain a statement that Houston 3() County will never accept or maintain the roads unless they meet the county 3 | standards in effect on the date of acceptance. 32 7.3 The subdivision plat must contain a statement that the roads will be maintained 33 in perpetuity by the owners in the subdivision, and must contain a mechanism for 34 assessing the owners to produce adequate revenue for perpetual maintenance. 7.4 35 The plat must contain a requirement that every deed contain notice to the grantee 36 that all roads and streets are private, that the owners will be perpetually liable for 37 maintenance, that the county will never accept it for maintenance, and that the 38 quality of the roads and streets affect access by public services such as police, fire 39 and EMS. 40 7.5 All arterial and major collector streets required by Section B.2.1 must be dedicated to the public and constructed to county standards. Other streets will he 41 42 dedicated to the homeowners association for the use of the property owners, their 43 assigns and successors, and emergency response individuals. 7.6 44 The owner and/or developer will place a sign at the entrance of the subdivision 45 clearly stating that the roads are private roads. 7.7 The owner and/or developer will form a homeowners association with assessment 46 47 authority. Membership in the association will be mandatory for each lot owner of 48 the private subdivision. The association will be responsible for the maintenance 49 of the roads in the subdivision. 5() 7.8 Any owner that gates the entrances to the subdivision shall provide either a crash 51 gate or a lock box and a letter of approval from all the affected emergency 52 response agencies stating their approval of full time access to the subdivision. 53 8. Building Sctbacks

54 8.1 The setback line on major highways and roads is set at 50 feet from the edge of the right-of-way.

The setback line on all public roads other than major highways and roads is set at 8.2 1 a minimal of 25 feet from the edge of the right-of-way. 2 3 9. Variances 9.1 4 The Houston County Commissioners' Court shall have the authority to grant 5 variances from these Regulations when the public interest or the requirements of justice demands relaxation of the strict requirements of the rules. 6 7 9.2 Any person who wishes to receive a variance should apply to the Precinct 8 Commissioner, who will place it on the agenda of the Court and present it with () his or her recommendation whether the variance should be granted. 9.3 The decision of the Court whether to grant or deny a variance is at its complete 10 II discretion, and will be final. 12 10. Penalties Section 232,005 of the Texas Local Government Code provides for the 13 10.1 14 enforcement of the state subdivision laws and of these Regulations. 10.2 A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or intentionally violates a 15 requirement of these Regulations, including the attached appendices. That 16 17 offence is a Class B Misdemeanor (punishable by a \$2000 fine and up to six (6) 18 months in jail). 19 10.3 Under Texas law, a person may be jointly responsible as a party to an offense if 20 the person (acting with intent to promote or assist the commission of the offense) 21 solicits, encourages, directs, aids, or attempts to aid another person to commit the 22 offense. Thus, a real estate agent or broker, a lender, an attorney, a surveyor, an 23 engineer, a title insurer, or any other person who assists in violating these 24 Regulations may also face criminal penalties. 25 10.4 Besides prosecuting a criminal complaint, the County Attorney may file a civil 26 action in a court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin any violation or threatened 27 violation of these Regulations, and to recover damages. 28 11.1 A tract that has been subdivided without compliance with these Regulations will be ineligible to obtain a permit for the construction or modifications of a Private 29 30 Sewage Facility located on the tract. 31 11. Savings Clause 32 11.1 If any specific section of these regulations be deemed unenforceable and/or void. 33 said determination will have no adverse effect on the enforceability of the 34 Houston County Subdivision Regulations as a whole.

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Appendix A Platting Guidelines

2 As a guide to the public in determining when it is necessary to file a plat and comply with 3 these Regulations, the Commissioners' Court (as an incident of its power to enforce the 4 subdivision laws and regulations under Section 232.003, Texas Local Government Code, 5 and with the specific authority of Section 232.0015) has adopted the following policy 6 guidelines stating when the division of an existing tract will be considered by the Court to 7 be a subdivision requiring the filing of a plat by law, and thus requiring compliance with these Regulations.

Al. Form of Sale

10 A 1.1 If a plat is required under these guidelines, it is immaterial that the sale of daughter tracts is by contract, option, long-term lease (60 months or more), or П 12 lease-purchase, rather than by deed, or that the daughter tracts are described by 13 metes and bounds rather than lot and block. 14

A2. Commercial Development

A2.1 Unless otherwise specifically exempted, a plat is always required when a parent tract is divided into two or more daughter tracts for sale as part or a unified plan for development of the property. The existence of such a plan may be inferred from circumstances, such as the form of advertising or the sale of multiple tracts within a one-year period.

A3. Resubdivision

A3.1 A plat is always required to divide a parent tract that is already located within a subdivision, even if one of the following exemptions would otherwise apply. In addition, partial vacation of any existing subdivision plat will be required simultaneously to resubdivision.

A4. Size of Lots

Lots will be a minimum of 1/2 acre per single family resident or one (1) acre if a private water well is to be place on land.

A4.2 A plat is required if any daughter tract will be less than 10 acres in area. If any daughter tract is out of compliance with this requirement, the owner and/or developer must plat the entire subdivision (including any tracts that do have 10 acres or more).

A5. Adjacent Lots

A5.1 A plat is not required when the owner of two or more distinct adjacent tracts sells one or more of them, so long as all existing tracts remain intact. To be distinct

tracts must have a history of separate use.

A6. Family Grants

No voids may be left within the subdivision with 12 the intent of avoiding responsibility for construction roads or bridges. 13 B2.2 When two (2) or more arterial streets are in a subdivision, cross-streets at a 14 maximum spacing of 1500 feet shall be provided to facilitate the movement of 15 emergency vehicles such as fire trucks and ambulances. More frequent spacing 16 for urban roads may be required, depending on traffic conditions and density. 17 B2.3 Dead end streets shall have a cul-de-sac with a minimum right-of-way radius of 18 100 feet (minimum base radius to be 50 feet) with "Dead End" or "No Outlet" 19 street signs, at private expense, placed over the street name sign, 20 B2.4 The County may require an internal street system that minimizes road cuts to 21 existing County or other public roadways. 22 B3. Other traffic control signs 46 shall be installed to indicate any unusual traffic or road hazard or conditions that may exist. All traffic control devices shall be placed in compliance with the 47 48 current standards of the Texas Department of Transportation and construction 49 costs shall be included in the security. 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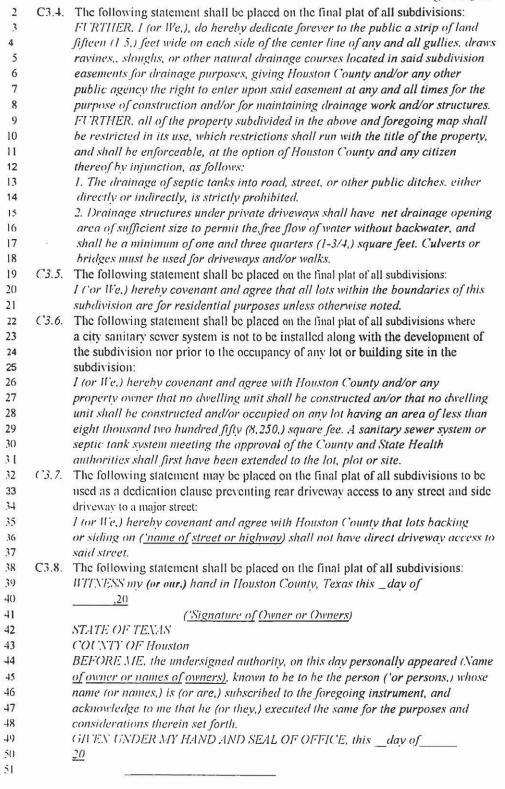

EXHIBIT "A"

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW SUBDIVISION ROADS IN HOUSTON COUNTY, TEXAS

- 1. All roads shall be a minimum of 40 feet in width.
- 2. All roads shall be crowned and sloped to an open ditch to allow for proper drainage.
- 3. When fill is necessary, a non-expansive select fill shall be used which has Atterberg Plasticity Index between 4 and 12, with a liquid limit of 35% or less and a maximum of 45% passing the No. 200 Sieve.
- 4. All fill shall be placed in 6" lifts and compacted to at least 95% of the maximum density determined by ASTM D 698.
 - . 5. Upon placement of fill material roads shall be topped with 6" crushed limestone base and compacted. The base material shall comply with the requirements of Type A. Grade 2 crushed stone, Item 247 of the TxDOT 1993 Standard Specifications for Construction of Highways. Streets and Bridges.
